Technically the name no longer applies, since this place recently swallowed up the floor above, but The Five Rooms still occupies a niche in the big, brash Barcelona hotel scene: it's slick without being smug; low-key without being low-rent; and rather than be designed by committee, it sprang from the creative mind of its owner, who lives next door attentive vet unobtrusive. Yessica worked in fashion before opting to style up (for her visiting business contacts) a sprawling first-storey apartment on leafy Pau Claris street, in the lower reaches of the suave Eixample district.

Her urban-loft look is in force throughout, and rather appealing



it is, too: an amalgam of French Empire and '50s-retro chairs, reupholstered in hot pink; cowhide rugs pooled on timber floors; recessed lighting in bedheads, creating a glow as romantic as candles; and attention-grabbing finds acquired on expeditions to Paris, including a monster dresser. Overall, the feeling is of laid-back apartment living. You can bypass reception if you're on the upper floor, and grab breakfast to go if you don't fancy sitting cheekby-jowl at the communal tables – possibly the most annoying trend in design hotels today.
